City yard sale promises deals galore

Shop till you drop will take on a whole new meaning the weekend of April 25-27, when the inaugural Circle City Yard Sale takes place.

The brainchild of graduate student **Mitchum Owen**, the citywide sale accomplishes a number of things: It gives yard-sale fanatics detailed information on where to shop, helps sellers rid their lives of junk and supports a good cause. The \$15 sellers fee posts your sale information on a searchable Web site (www.circlecitysale.org) that's bound to be more productive than those hand-written signs tacked to trees. Each listing gives the location, hours and a glimpse of what's for sale.

Teachers' Treasures gets 90 percent

of the fee, with the other 10 percent going to the Rotaract Club of Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis, a service club sponsored by the Rotary Club.

Some groups already have signed on, with Herron-Morton Place neighbors and the United Northwest Neighborhood Association hosting multi-family sales. There also will be a sale at Teachers' Treasures offices and another one for students and staff at IUPUI. Individual sales also are listed on the Web site.

Owen is upbeat about commitments for the sale.

"It is our first year, and we've gotten quite a good response," he said.
